

# QUARTERLY REPORT- OCTOBER TO DECEMBER 2019 CONSERVATION EDUCATION Afi, MBE, OKWANGWO



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### SUMMARY

This report covers conservation education activities implemented in Afi Mountain Wildlife Sanctuary, the Mbe Mountains, and Cross River National Park (Okwangwo Division) during the period from October to December 2019. Activities were implemented jointly by WCS and the management authority at each site based on a work plan developed jointly with the protected area's education staff. Activities implemented include 31 school visits by WCS and Cross River National Park staff, 13 schools exchange visits, and 12 guided field trips for schoolchildren. Others include film show in 30 villages and 2 schools. In addition, WCS facilitated 5 community meetings and intensified education and awareness activities on deforestation and bush burning. A total of 1,240 customized notebooks were distributed to raise awareness about the Preuss's monkey.

#### **FILM SHOW**

WCS uses film shows to raise awareness in local communities about great apes and other threatened wildlife. This quarter, great ape films were showed in 2 schools and 30 villages around Afi, Mbe and Okwangwo. The films attracted a total audience of 7,488 people (Table 1). To improve understanding, WCS staff facilitated discussions among the viewers on conservation issues highlighted in the films including threats and potential solutions.

# FIELD TRIPS

Field trips are a valuable way to connect young people to nature. They tend to produce lasting experiences that help to inspire people to place more value on wildlife, and make them more willing to support wildlife conservation. During this quarter, WCS organized 12 guided field trips for a total of 280 students and 24 teachers to the Mbe

Mountains, Cross River National Park, Afi Mountain Wildlife Sanctuary, Drill Ranch, and Becheve Nature Reserve (Table 2). The field trips provided students the opportunity to learn about the rainforest, threats to wildlife, and ongoing efforts to them. WCS and protected area staff at each site shared their knowledge and experiences with the students during the field trips.

#### SCHOOL VISITS

WCS and CRNP education staff visited conservation clubs in 31 schools in Afi, Mbe, and Okwangwo during this reporting period. Activities implemented during the visits include lessons, films, and puppet show (Table 3). The puppet show is an interesting new addition to conservation education activities implemented in schools. The show uses animal teddies, which catch children's attention and interest, to convey conservation messages to young primary school pupils. A total of 1,240 customized notebooks were distributed to schoolchildren during the visits.

# **EXCHANGE VISIT**

This quarter, WCS facilitated 13 exchange visits involving 26 conservation clubs and 1,534 students in schools within the Cross River gorilla landscape (Table 4). Exchange visit enable students and pupils in schools to share ideas and knowledge they have acquired about natural resource management including plants, animals, problems of conservation and possible interventions. Activities implemented during exchange visits include Cross River gorilla game, nature poems, quiz competition and great apes film show. These activities were carried out in a competitive manner helping to generate interest students.
